What information do we need?

Why do Nessy need this information?

How long will Nessy keep your information?

Personal data will be held in Nessy for as long as the pupil is using the service. Once an account is deleted, or deemed inactive (not accessed for a period of more than a year), the personal data associated will be anonymised. Schools will delete pupil records when they leave the school. Accounts and its associated personal data can be deleted upon request.

Your Rights
