CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. Entries must be sent to the address below and will be accepted on or before the 7th February 2025 to Mid Argyll Music Festival, c/o.14 Upper Glenfyne Park, Ardrishaig, PA30 8HH.
- 2. Entries will only be accepted on the official entry form.
- 3. All pieces will be own choice and titles **must** be stated on the entry form. **If title is not submitted or where a change occurs after this date, the performer may still perform and receive an adjudication, but no marks will be awarded** NB Changes to titles **must** be made in writing.
- 4. Copies of your music must be sent in along with your entry by 7th February 2025 for the Adjudicator. **Adjudicator Copy** A person performing a work in front of an adjudicator may make **one** photocopy for the adjudicator provided that the performer has purchased his/her own copy and that the copy is retained and destroyed by the adjudicator immediately after the Festival. The copy must be marked with the following "**Adjudicator Copy Destroy After Use**".
- 5. Those competitors requiring the services of the **Official Accompanist** are required to send a copy of their music along with the entry by 7th February 2024. This should be marked **Accompanist Copy Destroy After Use.** NB. copies used by performer must be originals. Competitors wishing to use their own accompanist in classes must state this clearly on the entry form. Please note that recorded backing tracks may be used.
- 6. The Festival Committee will decide upon the order in which classes will be taken and arrange the order of competing as soon as the list of entries has been closed.
- 7. In classes where there is a qualification as to age, the same will be taken as at the closing date of entry.
- 8. Decisions of the adjudicators shall in all cases be final.
- 9. Certificates will be awarded for the first **three** places in each class:

Honours90 marks and aboveDistinction85 marks and aboveMerit81 marks and above

- 10. The decision of the Festival Committee in all matters arising out of, or not specifically provided for in these Conditions, shall be final.
- 11. All trophies are held for the period of one year. Late return will incur a charge of £10.00. If trophies are not returned then the holder will be charged the cost of a replacement trophy.
- 12. Competitors must adhere to all conditions on entry in respect of pieces and time restrictions.

- 13. If a competitor exceeds the time limit set, the adjudicator may stop the performance but the competitor will not be disqualified as a result. (See individual classes)
- 14. Video and Audio recording is not permitted.

- A separate entry form must be used for each entry unless using the multiple entry form.

MID ARGYLL MUSIC FESTIVAL SAFEGUARDING POLICY

Class 7 Vocal Ensemble (Primary) min. THREE performers
Time Limit FIVE minutes. Must be unconducted.

One own choice.

Class 8 Vocal Ensemble (Secondary) min. THREE performers
Time Limit FIVE minutes. Must be unconducted.

One own choice.

ACTION SONGS

- Class 9 Action Song (Nursery & Pre-School Groups) Non Competitive
 One short song or singing game, accompanied or unaccompanied for a small group with appropriate and imaginative actions.
- Class 10 Action Song (Primary 1 3) Non Competitive
 One short song, accompanied or unaccompanied for a small group with appropriate and imaginative actions.

CHORAL CLASSES – see Rules 3, 4 & 5

Class 12 Primary Choirs

Own choice of TWO contrasting songs

Class 13 Intermediate Choirs (18 years & under) Time limit EIGHT minutes
Own choice of TWO contrasting songs

WOODWIND see Rules 3, 4 & 5

- Class 14 Woodwind Solo (Beginners Less than 1 year) time limit THREE minutes
 Own choice of ONE piece
- Class 15 Woodwind Solo (Primary School) time limit THREE minutes
 Own choice of ONE piece
- Class 16 Woodwind Solo (Secondary 1 3) Time limit FOUR minutes
 Own choice of ONE piece
- Class 17 Woodwind Solo (Secondary 4 6) Time limit FIVE minutes
 Own choice of ONE piece

BRASS see Rules 3, 4 & 5

- Class 18 Brass Solo (Beginners Less than 1 year) Time limit THREE minutes
 Own choice of ONE piece
- Class 19 Brass Solo (Primary School) Time limit THREE minutes Own choice of ONE piece
- Class 20 Brass Solo (Secondary 1 3) Time limit FOUR minutes Own choice of ONE piece
- Class 21 Brass Solo (Secondary 4 6) Time limit FIVE minutes Own choice of ONE piece

INSTRUMENTAL DUETS see Rules 3, 4 & 5

Class 22 Instrumental Duet (Primary)

Time limit FOUR minutes
Own choice of ONE piece or movement

Class 23 Instrumental Duet (Secondary)

Time limit FOUR minutes
Drum kit/percussion may be used but will not be provided
Own choice of ONE piece or movement

INSTRUMENTAL ENSEMBLES see Rules 3, 4 & 5

Any combination of instruments including recorder but excluding electronic instruments

Class 24 Instrumental Ensemble (Primary) minimum of 3 performers

Time limit FOUR minutes

Drum kit/percussion may be used but will not be provided

Own choice of ONE piece or movement

Class 25 Instrumental Ensemble (Secondary) minimum of 3 performers

Must be unconducted. Time limit FOUR minutes Drum kit/percussion may be used but will not be provided Own choice of ONE piece or movement

FUN CLASSES

Class 26 Music is Fun - Anything Goes! (Open)

This class is NON-COMPETITIVE

Open to soloists and groups of any age.

Own choice of vocal and/or instrumental, pop, folk, classical, mime, dance etc., with a total performance time not exceeding 5 minutes.
